**Maggie Lautzenheiser-Page, School Programs Coordinator** for LFS, says, "Student bus passes are one of the top needs that I see with our students. Due to high housing prices, our students occasionally have to move during the school year, so providing bus passes that would otherwise be unaffordable allows them to finish out the academic year

at a school where they have established relationships with students and teachers. "

**She continues,** "Whenever possible we try to provide them with a bus pass to get home so that they don't have to walk after dark. Any amount goes a long way with these kids, so thank you! LFS truly admires all that the Optimist Clubs do across Colorado, so thank you for including us as you continue to make a difference."

#### **Longtime Optimists Make Impact At History Colorado**

**Doug Morton** was an optimist, joining Monaco South OC in 1977 until his passing, and **Marilyn Brown** is a charter member of Tamarac Optimist Club. # Marilyn Brown, and How "the Future Can Learn from the Past"

What's a good piece of advice for anyone considering making an impact at History Colorado? "They should do it not just while they can see the results of their kindness but also with an eye toward paying it forward after they're gone." So says Marilyn Brown, who, with her late husband, Doug Morton, has been one of History Colorado's most generous contributors.

Prior to Doug's passing in 2016, his and Marilyn's longtime commitment to History Colorado included Doug's years of service on the board, a substantial donation to help preserve the Georgetown Loop Railroad®, and the establishment of a marital trust, which pays benefits to the surviving spouse and then to various charities. Ever since its opening in 2012, the History Colorado Center has boasted a grand staircase bearing the couple's names-a fact Marilyn calls "humbling" but a testament to the significance of their support of the museum Marilyn still loves to frequent. With fond memories of the former Colorado History Museum and its dioramas, she loves the new History Colorado Center for the variety and interactivity of its exhibits. "Also," she adds, "more people should go on Tours and Treks," a reference to History Colorado's long-running program of statewide jaunts for adults.

Doug and Marilyn met at a white elephant gift exchange, where she beat him in a pinball tournament. She was immediately smitten by his kindness and sense of humor. After three years of dating, the couple enjoyed twenty-nine years of marriage. Bronco games, holiday-season travel, and a regular Saturday shopping date—their favorite ritualwere the highlights of their years together.

Ever enthusiastic about History Colorado's mission, Marilyn refers to the couple's gifts as "a way the future can learn from the past." In that spirit, she has just made another significant donation, this time to the Executive Director's



Innovation Fund—a new initiative that ensures History Colorado will have resources ready to embrace time-critical programs, projects, and ideas, allowing us to provide superb experiences that our guests have come to expect.

Good financial planning, says Marilyn, wasn't as hard as she and Doug expected. Her other piece of advice is for couples to work with an attorney they trust. History Colorado is one of four charities that will receive residuals from their estate after Marilyn's passing. She cites Doug's organizational and leadership skills, along with his entrepreneurial spirit, for inspiring them both to establish a well-devised estate plan that takes care of family members first, as well as the charities that have come to rely on their support.

The **Type 1 Diabetes Optimist Club (T1DOC)** again this year is working on a project to help send kids with **Type 1 Diabetes (T1D)** to **Camp Colorado** conducted by the **American Diabetes Association (ADA)**. The camp will be held from July 1 thru July 6, 2018 at Eagle Lake camp in the heart of the Pike National Forest located about 9 miles from Woodland Park, Colorado. Members of the **T1DOC** want to thank those "**Optimist Clubs**" and individual "**Optimists**" who helped send kids to **Camp** last year and also thank those who have **already provided** financial support to send kids to the upcoming **2018 Camp**. Our goal this year is to help at least **30+ kids** and their families.



**T1D** is a very expensive disease with increasing costs for insulin, other supplies, and ongoing medical care. Families, even with insurance have a hard time

funding the \$665+ cost they need to send a child to Camp. Because of required around the clock glucose level monitoring most of these kids have no other opportunity to participate in a summer camp. **Camp Colorado** operates with over 100+ medically trained volunteers providing this 24/7 care. Parents also catch a short break from night-time care while their child is at Camp.

Your Club can help in any of the following ways:

- Underwriting the cost of a "Campership". A donation of \$330 covers about half of a child's cost to go to Camp. Smaller donations can be pooled with those from other donors.
- The T1DOC will again conduct an on-line auction in May hoping to raise \$10,000 to fund "Camperships" and support T1D research. "Optimist" members who can provide auction items are asked to contact the below T1DOC members. Gift cards/certificates, travel packages, wine baskets, event tickets, sports memorabilia items, lodging deals, greens fees, etc., etc., make great auction items.
- Watch for more information and be an active bidder when the on-line auction runs from May 20<sup>th</sup> to May 29th<sup>t</sup>. More info to follow.

CO/WY District is going to be sending 46 Colorado (and Wyoming) junior golfers to the 2018 Optimist International Junior Golf Championships (commonly referred to as **THE OPTIMIST**) in late July 2018 at PGA National (home of the PGA Honda Classic) in Palm Beach Gardens FL.



Of the 46, the seven age group winners (Boys 10-11, 12-13, 14-15, and 16-18 and Girls 10-12, 13-14, and 15-18) will each receive \$ 1,000, and the other 39 qualifiers will each receive \$500.

# Adding in the expenses incurred with running the three District qualifiers and the adult scramble fundraiser, we need to raise about \$40,000.

#### Personal Growth and Involvement (PGI) / Professional Development Program (PDP) By Larry Brown

At the 2nd CO/WY District Convention I said a few words about the PGI/PDP's but it was fast and I know several of you wanted to hear more about the programs. I left an article about the programs along with the PDP brochures on a table for your interest.

Over the past three years there has been a decline in Optimists participation in these programs at the District and Club levels. Why? A good question that leans toward the individual. Yep, why should you do this? Another good question that only you can answer.

- Optimist International developed these programs to allow Club Members to be recognized and appreciated for personal and professional accomplishments.
- It gives members an opportunity to participate in long-term Club involvement while learning more about Optimism.
- Gives each member the personal responsibility for his/her involvement in the Club's activities.
- Offers personal growth opportunities to each member.
- Provides members with Club meeting, membership recruitment and retention ideas.
- The PGI/PDP Programs offers every Optimist Club member the opportunity to grow personally and learn more about Optimism while advancing through ten levels of involvement, personal growth and achievement.
- PGI/PDP introduces you to Optimist International's Skills Development Modules on Public Speaking, Effective Time Management, Creative Problem Solving, Choosing Optimism as a Philosophy of Life, Orientation to Optimism for New Members, The Meeting Will Come to Order! A Parliamentary Procedure Manual, Team Building, Leadership Styles & Profiles and Mentoring - How to Build & Nurture a Relationship.

So, it all comes back to the individual to get involved to enhance their PGI/PDP growth that not only helps their club but provides a better understanding of Optimism.

There is a difference between PGI Passport and PDP brochure. If you have never started working on the PGI Passport, don't start it. Start your training with the PDP brochure. Those who have started the PGI Passport are encouraged to continue with the goal of completing Level X. The PDP brochure can be started even if you are working on the PGI Passport. You cannot transfer levels you have completed in the PGI Passport to the PDP brochure. Included in the PDP brochure are three levels of advanced training. This training cannot be started until all levels of PDP have been completed. Then, only one level of the advanced training can be started and should be completed within the year started.

PGI Levels completed you will be recognized with a color tab to place behind your OI pin. PDP Levels completed you will be recognized with a certificate. Advanced levels you will be recognized with a Bronze, Silver and Gold pin. **Club Presidents are responsible for a training program that will energize their club members.** Your club should have training at least once a month. The training is of your choosing to motivate your club members. For a start I recommend looking at your new member and mentor program training. Involvement is the key to a successful club training program.
