A total of 86 junior golfers from eight States teed it up at the third annual Optimist Junior Golf Tour event on a chilly, sunny Saturday, October 13, 2018, at Green Valley Ranch Golf Club (home of the Colorado Opens) in Denver CO. From almost anywhere on the course, you could see the spectacular snowcapped Rocky Mountains to the west.

About 9 am Saturday, the golfers made their way to their assigned holes for the 20-minute frost-delayed shotgun start. Boys and girls in five age divisions played their hearts out, vying for individual trophies and 23 exemptions into the 2019 Optimist International Junior Golf Championships (commonly referred to as THE OPTIMIST) to be played at Trump Doral Resort in Miami, Florida. THE OPTIMIST is returning to Doral after 23 years at PGA National Resort and Spa, Palm Beach Gardens FL, the home of the PGA Tour's Honda Classic.

By the end of the round, temperatures had risen to the low 60's.

Cheered on by their parents, grandparents, other family members, friends, and Optimist volunteers, the juniors played some great golf. It had been decided before play began Saturday morning that the scheduled 36-hole event would be shortened to 18 holes because Sunday's forecast called for up to six inches of snow and highs in the mid-20's.


