Their first project was to support the **Children's Hospital Colorado**. They decided to have a hot cocoa/lemonade stand during the Halloween Parade knowing so many parents and kids would be present. Due to Covid restrictions, for the lemonade they purchased bottles of water and lemonade and 'add in' packets then the customer could mix for themselves. For the hot





cocoa they had the individual packets of cocoa that the customer could open, and the kids provided the hot water from a huge "coffee maker" and again the customers could mix for themselves. The community really supported this project.

There was a joint Zoom meeting of the Optimist Club at Kullerstrand Elementary, the Optimist Club of Wheat Ridge, and Children's Hospital Colorado where the kids gave the \$317.00, they made to the hospital. They decided to split the funds 50% to the medical dog program and 50% to the toy program for the children in the hospital.

Their next project will be another hot cocoa/lemonade stand during the up-coming Christmas Concert at school and these funds will go the Foothills Animal Shelter.

CO/WY District Optimist Junior Golf Program Bob Meyer

The Optimist International Junior Golf Championships (commonly referred to as THE OPTIMIST) is one of Optimist International's major youth programs for boys and girls ages 10 – 18 and is one of the largest and best-known junior golf events in the world. More than 4,000 boys and girls across the United States, Canada, Mexico, and several dozen other foreign

countries compete in official Optimist qualifying tournaments. The best of these junior golfers, along with additional international junior golfers from around the globe, advance to **THE OPTIMIST**.

Each year, **THE OPTIMIST is held at Trump Doral Resort - Miami FL** and fields over 600 of the world's best junior golfers from more than 28 countries around the globe. College coaches come from all over the U.S. to scout some of the best junior players in the world.

Past age group winners at THE OPTIMIST (and its predecessor, the Optimist Junior World Golf Championships) include Denver's own Mark Hubbard, Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson, and Ernie Els, among dozens of prominent PGA and LPGA golfers.

The Colorado-Wyoming District Optimist Junior Golf Program is recognized as the best Junior Golf Program in all of Optimist International and serves over 400 junior golfers each year. The best of these golfers will qualify for THE 2022 OPTIMIST.

The 2022 District qualifying tournaments will be held Wednesday, June 15, at Flatirons Golf Course in Boulder (boys ages 10 - 15); Thursday, June 16, at Meadow Hills Golf Course in Aurora (girls ages 10 - 18); and Friday, June 17 at Flatirons Golf Course in Boulder (boys ages 16 - 18).

The Colorado-Wyoming District Optimist Junior Golf Program is totally self-funded. We sent 60 junior golfers to THE 2021 OPTIMIST and raised over \$ 45,000 for that purpose. We were able to give \$ 1,000 to each of the seven age group winners and \$ 500 to the 53 other qualifiers from the 2021 District qualifying events.

For THE 2022 OPTIMIST, we received an allocation of 71 spots, so we need to raise \$ 50,000 to maintain the level of financial assistance we've provided in the past. To boost our fund-raising activities in 2022, we will hold an ADULT SCRAMBLE FUNDRAISING TOURNAMENT AND SILENT AUCTION on Thursday, May 26, at Meadows Hills Golf Course in Aurora. Form on page 8


We will also solicit title, hole, banner, and player sponsors for the qualifying tournaments at Flatirons and Meadow Hills from many Colorado-Wyoming District Optimist Clubs, individual Optimists and their friends and businesses. In addition, we solicit cash and in-kind donations from local golf courses, parents of our junior golfers, and the general public.

Cadet Oratorical Contest.

Col. John Ramsey (Ret.), now deceased, created a program which encouraged cadets to develop the art of public speaking. The winners received cash awards and plaques at the JROTC Annual Awards Banquet each year.

Currently, the purpose is to educate high school students in leadership roles while making them aware of the benefits of citizenship. The mission of JROTC is to motivate young people to become better American citizens.

But it wasn't always this way. Richard Love, a former JROTC cadet, administered the progam for many years. In the '40's when he was in high school, cadets learned how to put machine guns together and assemble rifles.

Topics for the speeches have ranged over a number of subjects. **This year's topic was "Which Freedom in the Bill of Rights is the Most Important to Me and Why."** We heard cadets address different ideas, but in each case, you could tell that a great deal of thought and even research when into their presentations. They are graded on poise, delivery, logic, etc. so this event is taken quite seriously.

The leadership of JROTC feels that the Optimists' program is valuable because public speaking is a part of preparing for leadership which is one of their objectives.


